Mission Statement of the ACPA, Inc.

The mission of the ACPA is to focus attention on local, state and regional issues related to crime prevention and provide a forum for the exchange, coordination and teaching of ideas, concepts and programs pertaining to the reduction of crime.

Description of Programs and Services

The Arizona Crime Prevention Association (ACPA) has been providing crime prevention services to Arizona since 1977 and officially became a Corporation in 1993. The majority of the Board of Directors is made up of individuals working in law enforcement as well as some successful, local business and community members. All members of the Board serve voluntarily and no paid staff exists.

The purpose of the Arizona Crime Prevention Association is:

- To provide a forum for the exchange, coordination, and teaching of ideas, concepts and programs pertaining to the reduction of crime. This is done by offering a variety of specialized training and education sessions, meetings, conferences and webinars for the citizens of Arizona as well as specialized training for law enforcement.
- To focus attention on local, regional, state and national goals and issues relating to crime prevention. This is done through the development and delivery of specialized public programs and focused public advertisement. This includes the production and delivery of educational television commercials distributed and aired statewide as well as interviews for newspaper and radio stations on current crimes and prevention methodology.
- To encourage extensive citizen and community involvement in the reduction of crime and criminal activity. Our organization does this through the hosting of various Citizen and Business Safety Forums. Offered annually in partnership with law enforcement throughout the state, these educational sessions provide an opportunity for individuals to gain knowledge about particular crime trends, programs, services and products. These sessions also gives individuals the opportunity to network with local police representatives.
- To develop strategies which promote crime prevention planning and implementation for Arizona citizens. Currently the ACPA, Inc. has developed a state database for distribution of police information to the general public and other valley police agencies called BoloCop. Through this program, the website allows law enforcement to easily distribute police related information and crime alerts directly to valley police agencies, focused business and community members via email, text and/or facsimile transmittal. The website is www.Bolocop.com with plans to expand nationally in the future.

The organization provides the following programs and services:

- 1.) Specialized training: The ACPA, Inc. recruits, develops and delivers training on a variety of crime related issues to sworn and civilian members of law enforcement, corporate loss prevention staff, civic organizations, government and citizenry of the state.
- 2.) Child Identification Clinics: In partnership with law enforcement throughout the state and the Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the ACPA, Inc. provides parents a laminated child identification card, as well as a cd of information specific to their child to include digital fingerprints, photos, video and audio files. These digital files can be easily emailed to law enforcement by the parents should it be necessary.
- 3.) Public Secured Shred: In partnership with law enforcement and various mobile shred companies, the ACPA, Inc. hosts public, secured shredding. This opportunity allows citizen's the ability to shred personal documents which reduces the chances of becoming a victim on identity theft.
- 4.) Crime Prevention Advertisement Campaigns: In partnership with law enforcement agencies throughout the state as well as various city cable and public television networks, the ACPA, Inc. produces and provides a variety of education and public safety prevention videos. These videos distributed through various police agencies assist in delivering messages to the general public about such current crime issues as the dangers of social networking sites, leaving property in your vehicle, theft of intellectual property and child safety.
- 5.) Statewide administration of a program known as **BOLOCOP**, which allows police agencies to prepare and send crime alerts statewide to focused business and community members. BOLOCop.com will be launched nationally in the future.
- 6.) International administration of a program known as **SAFETY KIDS**, which provides educational curriculum for public safety, schools and the community to teach safety skills to the worlds youth. SAFETYKIDS.ORG is a web based program allowing subscribers access to curricula, music, videos and digital publication media as tools to present the program.
- 7.) Statewide mapping of prescription medication collection boxes located at public safety agencies. These boxes allow community members to properly dispose of unused prescription medications so it does not end up in the hands of youth or criminals.

2015 ACPA Campaigns

- **DISTRACTED DRIVING...**In 2014, the Arizona Crime Prevention Association created a brochure on the impact of Distracted Driving. The brochure included information from www.Distracted.gov to explain the dangers of taking your eyes off the road for any amount of time. A sticker is included to remind drivers "One Text Or Call Could WRECK It All". Board Members distributed the campaign during 2015 at both ACPA and their agency events for free. 200 were provided to Prescott Valley Police and 200 to Mesa Police who handed them out at the County Fair.



- **BIKEGUARD...**The Arizona Crime Prevention Association is partnered with **BikeGuard**, a free bicycle registration program providing free **Asset Tags** to assist in identifying bicycles. Many cities may provide a similar service, but in most cases, the program is exclusive to the city. This makes it difficult for law enforcement in other cities or states and citizens to obtain owner information when the bike is found unless the bike has been reported stolen and the serial number was provided to law enforcement.

- **BOLOCOP...**Statewide administration of a program known as BOLOCOP which allows police agencies to prepare and send crime alerts statewide to participating businesses and community members. The program has grown tremendously over the last 2-years with over 1000 alerts sent and **41,291** visitors. In 2015 ACPA President Jerry Quarles and Past President Vickie Owen visited 22 law enforcement partners throughout Arizona to educate them about the program and to provide resources. Additionally, the “Silver Directory” was added as an update which allows loved-ones of family members who have Alzheimer’s or Dementia to pre-register them on the website. This registration provides a tool for law enforcement in the event the loved-one goes missing.

LEND YOUR EYES AND EARS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT

You can help police solve crimes in your community if you're willing to "BOLO" (Be On the Look Out). An easy way to do this is to register at BOLOCop.com, a



web-based communication program that will send

you alerts from law enforcement agencies seeking the public's help on a range of public safety issues, including locating missing persons, identifying probation violation offenders, and recovering stolen property. The service also distributes information about crime trends that may be impacting your neighborhood.

Created in 2012 by Gilbert Police Crime Prevention Officer Vickie Owen and website developer Steven Mueller, BOLO Cop is used by hundreds of federal and state law enforcement officials to distribute critical police information in a variety of ways to individuals and businesses. The site will soon add a national registry known as the "Silver Directory" which allows members of the public to add information about a loved one suffering from dementia which can be used by police to find the individual's home should they be found or if they need to activate a Silver Alert.

BOLO Cop had its origins in a fax-based service started by Peggy and Paul Secaur in 1990. After Paul received a business fax that helped him and police apprehend a purse thief in the building he worked in, Paul and Peggy got the idea for Fax Net 1 and started sharing faxes with neighboring businesses about crimes in the area. Within weeks of launching the service, police were able to catch a bank robber, break up a counterfeit ring, locate an elderly man suffering from dementia and divert an attempted rapist.

Paul and Peggy were featured in the [April 2013 issue of our newsletter](#). Their idea lives on in BOLO Cop.
